Vehicle Requirements	Vehicles shall comply with per the Technical Appendix Schedule A and Group 4H, current VMC Standing Regulations and current Group5 Series Regulations. Winter tread, bar, Mud/Snow pattern, hand cut or rally type tyres are not allowed. Tyres marked "Not for Road Use" or similar cannot be used in the production classes. Fuel must comply with Schedule G of the Motorsport Australia Manual. Vehicles must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions.												
Classes / Categories	As per current VMC Standing Regulations and Group5 Series Rules (see General Event Information).												

Document Verification and	Pre-Event: Online via the MEE, which includes driver declaration and self-scrutiny statement.
Vehicle Scrutiny	At Event: Visual confirmation of a valid Club Membership and Competition license. Entrants must provide a signed Self Scrutiny Statement. Drivers of Log booked cars must provide a copy of the current event history page of their Motorsport Australia Logbook and submit via email to the Event Secretary. Targeted Scrutiny will occur on each day between 8:30 and 9:45am.
Event Conditions	Tests will be as per the current Motorsport Australia Motorkhana Test Booklet except test dimensions may be varied from the specified minima and tests may be set up in a mirror image and/or run in the opposite direction. Timing will be electronic, with manual back-up stop watches. Timers and all officials are Judge of Fact. Results will be determined by the lowest aggregate of elapsed times on the tests completed, plus any penalties. Separate Results will be provided for both the VMC and Group5 components of the event.
Event Schedule	Competition will commence at approximately 10.00 am following the drivers briefing.
Passengers in Vehicles	This Event will include a Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the Motorsport Australia MSPRA Policy. A single Passenger is permitted in competing vehicles providing they are over 12yo and have signed the Passenger Entry Form. The Passenger Entry Form will be available at book in each day and during the event.
Awards	Awards will be provided in accordance with the current VMC and Group5 Series Rules at the subsequent events for each series.
MSPRA	This Event will include a Motor Sport Passenger Ride Activity (MSPRA) which shall be run under and in accordance with the Motorsport Australia MSPRA Policy. A single Passenger is permitted in competing vehicles providing they are over 12yo and have signed the Passenger Entry Form.
Insurance	Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by Motorsport Australia in relation to the Event. Further details can be found in the Motorsport Australia Insurance Handbook, available also www.motorsport.org.au

VMC CLASSES - As per 2024 Victorian Motorkhana Championship Standing Regulations. (Based on vehicle Wheelbase)

Class A: Production Cars: 2WD up to 2150 mm wheelbase; Class B: Production Cars: 2WD 2151-2390mm wheelbase;

Class C: Production Cars: 2WD 2391 – 2574mm wheelbase; **Class D**: Production Cars: 2WD 2575 mm and over wheelbase;

Class E: Production Cars: AWD# or 4WD#

Class F: Specials

Class H: Production Based Specials Category J: Juniors [refer notes 1, 4, 6] Category L: Ladies [refer notes 4, 6] Category M: Masters [refer notes 3, 4, 6] Category N: Novices [refer notes 2, 4, 6]

Notes:

1. Juniors are defined as having attained the age of 12 years, being under 18 years of age on the day of the first scheduled VMC round in the year of competition.

- 2. Novices are defined as competitors who have accumulated less than 9 class, category or outright points in any previous year of VMC competition (excluding the current year's competition).
- 3. Masters must have attained 65 years of age on the day of the first scheduled VMC round in the year of competition.

4. For Categories J, L, M and N, a handicap system will operate based on the class of the competing automobile. Handicap factors will be - A 0.90, B 0.85, C 0.84, D 0.78, E 0.85, F 1.00, H 0.94

5. Competitors are eligible to compete and to gain points in only one class at each round.

The chosen class must be nominated on the entry form.

6. Eligible competitors may compete and gain points in a maximum of one category at each round. The chosen category must be nominated on the entry form. Note that a competitor who enters a category is also entered in a class and may gain awards and points in both.

7. A competitor may be reclassified or recategorized for individual round awards (e.g. trophies) at the discretion of the Clerk of the Course if the competitor's nominated class/ category has less than 3 entries. This will not change that competitor's class/category for annual awards points.

GROUP5 CLASSES - As per 2024 Group5 Non Speed Regulations. (Based on vehicle length)

Class B: Up to 4250mm - Engine Away from Driven Wheel

Class C: 3950mm and over - Engine Over Driven Wheels

Class D 4251mm and over - Engine Away from Driven Wheels

Class E All Wheel Drive Production Vehicles

Class F: Specials / & Non production cars*.

Class J1: Inexperienced Juniors under the age of 18 as of the first round of the year.

Class J2: Experienced Juniors under the age of 18 as of the first round of the year.

Class L: Ladies

Juniors and Ladies will be scored on the basis of handicap factors for each class. Handicap factors are as follows:



- the failure or unsuitability of facilities (including grand-stands, fences and guard rails) to ensure my safety.

Exclusion of Liability, Release and Indemnity
In exchange for being able to attend or participate in the Motorsport Activities, I will and agree to:

- to release Motorsport Australia and the Entities to the extent that any or all of them are providing Recreational Services from all liability for:
 - my death:
 - any physical or mental injury (including the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of such an injury);
 - the contraction, aggravation or acceleration of a disease including but not only COVID-19;
 - the coming into existence, the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of any other condition, circumstance, occurrence, activity, form of behaviour, course of conduct or state of affairs:
 - that is or may be harmful or disadvantageous to me or the community; or
 - that is or may be harmful or disadvantageous to me or the community,
 that may result in harm or disadvantage to me or the community,
 - any claim for any costs and expenses I may incur as a consequence of any of the above; arising from my participation in or attendance at the Motorsport Activities;

- to indemnify and hold harmless and keep indemnified Motorsport Australia and the Entities to the maximum extent permitted by law in respect of any Claim by any person; and
- to attend at or participate in the Motorsport Activities at my own risk.

I understand that:

- nothing in this document excludes, restricts or modifies any rights that I may have as a result of significant personal injury that is caused by the Reckless Conduct of Motorsport Australia and the Entities as the supplier of the Motorsport Activities and Recreational Services;
- nothing in this document prevents Motorsport Australia and the Entities from relying on any laws (including statute and common law) that limit or preclude their liability; nothing in this document excludes any term or guarantee which under statute cannot be excluded, however the liability of Motorsport Australia and the Entities is limited to the minimum

- nothing in this document precludes me from making a claim under a Motorsport Australia insurance policy where I am expressly entitled to make a claim under that insurance policy; and Motorsport Australia has arranged for limited personal injury insurance coverage which may provide me with some protection for loss, damage or injury that I may suffer during my participation in the Motorsport Activities. I acknowledge and accept that the insurance taken out by Motorsport Australia may not provide me with full indemnity for loss, damage or injury that I may suffer during my participation in the Motorsport Activities, and that I may have to pay the excess if a Claim is made under an insurance policy on my behalf. I agree that my own insurance arrangements are ultimately my responsibility and I will arrange any additional coverage at my expense after taking into account Motorsport Australia's insurance arrangements, this document and my own circumstances.

Where Motorsport Activities are held in the following jurisdictions, I acknowledge that I have also read and accept the following warnings:
Under Australian Government Consumer Law (which is part of the Competition and Consumer Act 2010 (Commonwealth)), several guarantees are implied into contracts for the supply of certain goods and services. - are rendered with due care and skill:
- are reasonably fit for any purpose which I either expressly or by implication, make known to the supplier; and

 might reasonably be expected to achieve any result I have made known to the supplier.
 Under section 22 of the Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012 (Vic), the supplier is entitled to ask me to agree that these conditions do not apply to me. I understand that If I sign this form, I am agreeing that any rights to sue the supplier under the Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012 If I am killed or injured because the services were not in

accordance with these guarantees, are excluded, restricted or modified in the way set out in this form.

Note: I note that the change to my rights, as set out in this form, does not apply if my death or injury is due to gross negligence on the supplier's part.

"Gross negligence" in relation to an act or omission, means doing the act or omitting to do an act with reckless disregard, with or without consciousness, for the consequences of the act or omission. See regulation 5 of the Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Regulations 2012 and section 22(3)(b) of the Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012.

Warning Applicable in Relation to Motorsport Activities Held in South Australia
Under sections 60 and 61 of The Australian Consumer Law (SA), if a person in trade or commerce supplies me with services (including recreational services), there is a statutory guarantee that those services:

- will be rendered with due care and skill; and
- any product resulting from those services, will be reasonably fit for the purpose for which the services are being acquired (as long as that purpose is made known to the supplier); and
- any product resulting from those services, will be of such a nature, and quality, state or condition, that they might reasonably be expected to achieve the result that the consumer wishes to achieve, (as long as that wish is made known to the supplier or a person with whom negotiations have been conducted in relation to the acquisition of the services.

Excluding, Restricting or Modifying My Rights:

Under section 42 of the Fair Trading Act 1987 (5A), the supplier of recreational services is entitled to ask me to agree to exclude, restrict or modify their liability for any personal injury suffered by me or another person for whom, or on whose behalf, I am acquiring the services (a third party consumer). If I sign this form, I am agreeing to exclude, restrict or modify the supplier's liability with the result that compensation may not be payable if I or the third party consumer suffer personal injury.

I do not have to agree to exclude, restrict or modify my rights by signing this form. The supplier may refuse to provide me with the services if I do not agree to exclude, restrict or modify my rights by signing this form. - related bodies corporate) and each of their organs and agencies, officers/president/directors/executives, employees, servants, agents, partners, providers, members, competitors, drivers, co-drivers, navigators, officials, crew members, service crew, delegates, licence holders, representatives, commissions, committees, advisers, trustees, councils, panels, shareholders, volunteers, officials, appointees, delegated bodies and sponsors,
- "Motorsport Activities" means any motorsport activities or Recreational Services which are permitted or approved which Motorsport Australia regulates or administers or otherwise are under the responsibility / control of Motorsport Australia;
- "Motorsport Australia" means the Confederation of Australia Motor Sport Ltd. trading as Motorsport Australia;
 "Reckless Conduct" means conduct where the supplier of the recreational services is aware, or should reasonably have been aware, of a significant risk that the conduct could result in personal injury to another person and engages in the conduct despite the risk and without adequate justification
- "Recreational Services" means (unless otherwise defined in this document) services that consist of participation in:
- a sporting activity; or
- a similar leisure time pursuit or any other activity that:
 - involves a significant degree of physical exertion or physical risk; and
 - is undertaken for the purposes of recreation, enjoyment or leisure.
